Maple Lane Community Fridge

Every school in Richmond has a community fridge as part of an initiative to address food insecurity. It allows students and staff to access healthy food needed. We have been teaching students about food insecurity, food equity, how to share resources, and understanding wants and needs.

A student can access the fridge when they need food. For example, they may have finished their lunch and are still hungry or they may have forgotten their lunch at home. We also know that some families will benefit from accessing food from the fridge as a supplement to the food they have sent with their child. We want to normalize accessing food from the fridge when it is needed. At the same time, we want to make sure students understand the difference between a need and a want. We do not want students to take food from the fridge because they prefer it to the food they brought from home. This will only lead to food waste and will deplete a valued resource. We want students to understand what it means to share a common resource and to be thoughtful in how and why they access food from the fridge. We encourage families to talk at home about the purpose of the community fridge and to reinforce the difference between wants and needs.

This is a very active time of the year for students. For families that are able to, we encourage you to send extra food with their children if they are getting hungry at school on a regular basis.
