## **September 30 - Orange Shirt Day and National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**

In 2013, Phyllis Webstad began telling her story of her experiences at residential school. On her first day at St. Joseph's Mission Residential School, Phyllis had her new orange shirt, which was gifted to her by her grandmother, taken away from her. Wearing an orange shirt has become a way to honour the Indigenous children who were forced into Canada's residential school system and to recognize the impact these schools had on Indigenous communities. On September 29, we ask our students to wear orange.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation was first recognized in 2021 as a way to honour the children who were forced to attend residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Residential schools existed between 1831 and 1996. Thousands of First Nations, Inuit and Métis children were forced to attend these schools, where their culture was stripped from them.

Students at Maple Lane have been learning about residential schools and have been asked to make a commitment to reconciliation. These commitments will be displayed in our school.

Families prepare with festive meals and many attend synagogue services and wear white, symbolizing purity. After the fast, a joyful meal is shared with family and friends, marking the start of a new, fresh year.

In 2025, Yom Kippur begins at sundown on Wednesday, October 1, 2025, and ends at nightfall on Thursday, October 2, 2025.
